# From the Desk of Mrs. Calteux....continued:

Here are a few game ideas to make math fact practice fun:

- Roll & Solve Roll two dice to create an addition, subtraction, or multiplication problem (e.g., if you roll a 3 and a 5, the problem could be 3 + 5 or 3 x 5).
- Math Bingo Use bingo cards with math facts, and call out answers instead of numbers.
- *Math Card War* Use a deck of cards (remove face cards or assign them values). Each player flips two cards to create a math problem, and the one with the higher answer wins the round.
- Math Fact Hopscotch Write math facts in each hopscotch square. As they hop on each square, they must solve the math fact.

# Meet Youth Success Coalition Partner: The LEO Program

The LEO (Learn and Empower Oneself) Program is an evidence-based, interactive substance prevention program that seeks to empower youth to understand their unique brains and quickly improve resilience, adaptability, and fearlessness in a rapidly changing world. By promoting higher-brain activation and resiliency through key tools, youth can reduce stress and anxiety, and improve memory, creativity, self-awareness, and overall quality of life - each of which are key factors in preventing substance use.





The LEO Program serves youth ages 12-20 and works with school and community partners to deliver program curriculum and one-on-one mentorship to youth. The LEO Program operates two separate contracts funded through the Brighter Futures Initiative Substance Prevention grant via the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families in both Adams County (operated by Adams County Health and Human Services in partnership with CW Solutions) and Wood County (operated by Wood County Human Services in partnership with CW Solutions). - 1) Register your family:
  - a. On or after <u>Ocotober 15, 2024</u> please complete the online referral form at <a href="https://wisconsin-rapids-wi.toysfortots.org">https://wisconsin-rapids-wi.toysfortots.org</a> and click "Apply for Toys" (Preferred); OR
  - b. Fill out the referral form (**please print**) and make sure to include age and gender and a cell phone contact number;
  - c. Return the referral form to the main office of your child's school by December 02, 2024.
  - d. Please only complete one referral form.
- 2) You will receive an email acknowledgement that your application has been received.
- 3) Toy pickup will be on 12/14/2024 from 9 am-12:30 pm at Mariani Cold Storage located at 1909 32<sup>nd</sup> St N, Wisconsin Rapids. There is no assigned time. Please bring your acknowledgement letter with you.
- 4) This will be the only opportunity to pick up your toys. In the event you cannot attend the pickup please send an authorized individual, with your ackowledgment letter, to the pickup on your behalf.




### Kale is the Harvest of the Month for November!
