Chromebooks

Textbooks/Supplies

Any library books, textbooks or supplies that have been checked out to students MUST be returned the teacher/library on their last day of school. If not returned, the student will be assessed a fee in Skyward Fee Management. Parents/guardians should check Fee Management periodically and take care of any obligations as soon as possible. Do not wait until your student is a senior as these fees can add up.

Yearbooks

The 2023-24 Yearbooks will be distributed on Friday, May 24th. Students should listen to announcements for pick up times. To have it ready for spring distribution, the staff had to finish the book by March 1st, which didn't allow time to cover important spring events. Memory-making events such as graduation, the musical, and spring sports will NOT be included in the book. These events will be covered in a full color spring supplement that comes with a self-stick tape to allow students to permanently attach it to their yearbook. This year, supplements were included with the cost of the book. We will finish designing the pages by the end of the school year, so it will be ready for pickup next fall. Seniors have the option to pay \$2.00 to have the supplement mailed to them, more information will be at yearbook pick up. Watch for announcements on school social media for more specific pick up information.

May is <u>NATIONAL</u> <u>ASTHMA</u> <u>AND</u> <u>ALLERGY</u> <u>AWARENESS MONTH!</u> It is the peak season for asthma and allergies. We have already had several warmer days and this will continue so please make sure your student has any needed medication (inhalers, antihistamines) at school to help combat allergies. **Any inhalers at school will need a doctor's order. Review your child's asthma action plan with the school nurse as needed. High school students: may self-carry inhalers with a doctor's order allowing self-carry and may carry their over-the-counter store-bought medications (Tylenol, Ibuprofen, etc), but must be in the original container.

!! Did you know: From Asthma & Allergy Foundation of America (AAFA) !!

The most common asthma triggers include allergies, air pollution, and other airborne irritants, other health conditions include respiratory infections, exercise or physical activity, weather and air temperature, strong emotions, and some medicines. Asthma triggers vary from person to person. Some people react to only a few while others react to many. Keep in mind that dry wind, cold air, or sudden changes in weather or temperature can sometimes bring on an asthma episode.

MEDICATIONS

As we near the end of another school year, we would like to remind you that any over-the-counter medications, EpiPens, and inhalers that your student has at school will be sent home with them at the end of the year. Any controlled medication (seizure or ADHD) will need to be picked up by a parent/guardian or other adults. If any extra medication is not picked up by the end of the year, it will be properly disposed of.

Summer School-medication

If your child is enrolled in summer school and needs daily medication or emergency medication, please be sure they have a new doctor's order; the order used during the school year will not be sufficient.

****16 months through 23 months: 3 DTP/DTaP/DT, 2 Polio, 1 MMR, 2 Hep B, 3 Hib, 3 PCV

******2 years through 4 years: 4 DTP/DTaP/DT, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 1 Var, 3 Hep B, 3 Hib, 3 PCV *****Kindergarten through grade 6: 4 DTP/DTaP/DT, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var, 3 Hep B

*****Grade 7 through grade 12: 4 DTP/DTaP/DT, 1 Tdap 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 2 Var, 3 Hep B

If your child should not receive immunizations for any reason, please fill out the waiver found at the bottom of the record form signed by a parent/guardian or physician, and return it to the school nurse. ACT Superscoring

ACT® will now provide an automatic <u>ACT</u> <u>Superscore</u> to all students who have taken the <u>ACT®</u> test more than once since September 2016. Scores earned during ACT District Testing are included in determining a student's Superscore.

Congratulations to the advisor, Mr. Kurt Jensen, and his yearbook staff for creating an award-winning yearbook.




