B. Grove Elementary Staffing

As a part of Every Student Succeeds Act, all districts that receive Title I funding are required to address in their local plan how they will ensure that low-income students and students of color are not disproportionately taught by new and out-of-field teachers. Grove Elementary was identified as having low-income students and students of color as disproportionately taught by inexperienced teachers. These categories come from federal law and are defined in terms of licensure and experience. WRPS has responded to the identification by providing our ESEA plan provisions related to addressing the disproportionality which include the support the District provides to our new hires, especially those with less than five years of teaching experience. We are waiting for further guidance from the Department of Instruction as to whether further steps will need to be taken to help address this inequity.

C. Wage Comparison

The Human Resources department collected wage information from local districts to compare with the WRPS pay structure.
