Per Board guidelines, new proposal information is brought to the board in October for discussion. The board will vote on possible approval of new course proposals in November. The District CII provides an advisory vote to the Board after they hear the discussions of the proposals

- b. Advanced Video, Digital and Graphic Arts (Jeanine Kleman)

The current art courses contain snippets of video, digital and graphic arts. This will be a technology based course and will allow students to expand on making videos, editing, etc. It will be a 1 term course for 1/2 credit and will possibly be taught simultaneously with another advanced course so as not to increase FTE numbers.

- c. Social Studies Curriculum (Jacob Bertagnoli)
 - i. Game Changers: Tracing History Through Sports

 This course will be for 11th and 12th grade students and will be 1/2 credit. This
 course will be US history based supported by trends in the world of sports that
 affected history. The research for this course is based on a book written by
 college professors.
 - ii. America's Voice dropping this course due to low enrollment
 - iii. America's Story dropping this course due to low enrollment
- d. **Proposed Changes to Science Course Offerings** (Dave Bergerson)
 - i. Earth Structure and Processes
 - This course is currently offered to 9th 12th grade students but will be changed to just 9th 10th grade students due to the lower level of rigor in the course that is appropriate for the student's grade level. A student with an IEP may enroll in this course at any grade level in order to fulfill the requisites for graduation.
 - ii. Meteorology, Oceanography, Climatology

 The prerequisite of Earth Structure and Processes will be removed. The content
 of this course doesn't rely on a progression that is currently implied with a
 required prerequisite.
 - iii. Physical Geology

iv. Topics in Physical Science

There will be a change to students eligible for the course. Revised language:

This course is not open to students who have previously earned a grade of
C- or higher in a course in Chemistry, Physic, or Earth Science at Lincoln.

Rationale: This course is designed for a 16-19 score band of the ACT standards for Science, therefore students who have already been successful in more specific courses have no academic need to step down to a less rigorous course.

v. Topics in Life Science

There will be a change to students eligible for the course - This course is not open to students who have earned a grade of C- or higher in a Biology course at Lincoln.

vi. Physics 101

Physics 101 was canceled this year because of changes to the contract with UW system. It will not be offered in the future unless there are changes to UW System requirements or to the course structure at LHS.

vii. AP Environmental Science

This course last ran in 2020-21 with 11 students. Prior to that, it ran in 2015-2016 with 9 students. For the last two registration cycles, there have been zero course requests. It is difficult for students to meet the prerequisites for the course as set by AP, and we do not have a person on staff who has been trained to teach it. We will be removing it from the course offerings.

e. JROTC

The application that was filled out has been accepted. This course will be offered in the 2025-2026 school year. It must be taught by a service member. The job has been posted and applications are coming in. This is a service type of course that will have students getting involved in leadership and community service projects. Students will not be required to join the military upon completion.
