School Learning Objective

During the 24-25 school year, 100% of Woodside students who attend Woodside 90% of the school year in grades K-5, will show ELA growth as determined by district academic screener*;

- Students below grade level at the beginning of the year will show over a year's growth by the end of the year.
- Students at grade level at the beginning of the year will be at grade level, or above, at the end of the year.
- Students above grade level at the beginning of year will show a year's growth or more, at the end of the year.
- Students with an IEP ELA goal will be on track to meet end of the year IEP goals.
